Dear "Animal Friends",

For many of you, this is my first opportunity to reach out and introduce myself. My name is Tara Bowser, and I stepped into the role of Executive Director in June, after serving as Interim Director for four months. Although this role is still very new to me, being an Animal Friends employee is one that is very familiar.

My career with Animal Friends began 12 years ago, in October 2006, at the "old" shelter in Trenton. Then Executive Director, Leland Gordon, hired me on as part-time kennel help, which worked perfectly with my full-time schedule as mom to two rowdy toddlers, Breanna & Jacob. Being an animal lover since I was a toddler myself, I knew it was only a matter of time before I began investing even more of my time at Animal Friends. When a full-time office position opened up a few months later, I decided to apply for it and began working alongside Becky and LaShon that coming January. From there, I had the privilege of becoming Foster Coordinator, Rescue Coordinator, Kennael Manager, and then Operations Manager, a position created in 2011, and held only by me up until July of this year. Throughout the past 12 years, I have also spent my fair share of time working alongside our amazing surgery staff and the Dog Warden's Office - from assisting with various surgeries to helping clear out animals from the homes of hoarders. I have even had the pleasure of being a puppy handler the last 3 years for all six of our Puppy Bowl pups, traveling each football season, with my husband Dan in tow, to New York City to film with Animal Planet.

None of this, however, would have been possible without the support and guidance of our former ED, Meg Stephenson. I had the honor of working hand in hand with Meg during her entire career at Animal Friends. From her, I was able to learn what it takes to lead an organization to greatness. I appreciate the role Meg played in helping me get to where I am today, and I can only hope that my years as ED brings as much success as hers did.



I have loved animals since I was a child, but have only gotten involved in the rescue world about 5 years ago. I have a love for the pitbull-type dog, and believe that every dog is an individual. I believe in positive reinforcement and creating a trusting bond with the dog. I really look forward to meeting more people and helping more dogs.

In Texas I was able to take dogs on "field trips" away from the shelter. We would go to the lake, park, and any store that allowed. It was great to see the positive change in these dogs. I was also able to report any behavioral challenges back to the shelter staff. I have been fortunate enough to keep in touch with the first dog I really helped by getting him out of the shelter and personally transporting him to off-site adoption events. Whenever I feel stressed or defeated, I always remember a little tan pitbull named Jensen, and how he helped me to start this journey. I thank all the Animal Friends staff and volunteers for letting me continue my journey with this great organization."

"I started walking dogs around the time AFHS opened the present location- fall of 2009. It was during one of my dark days of unemployment, and ultimately, I was planning on listing volunteering on my resume. My mother says it was her idea. Well, I found a job before it became necessary. I love dogs & bicycles, so on Sunday I would ride my bike to AFHS, walk dogs, ride back home then visit Mom. Things have changed since then- my mother passed on and I retired, but I still walk dogs.

When I was a kid, I had a dog, and two older sisters. I played with the dog but not my sisters. In the sixth grade, they had a bake sale at school to raise money for charity. One of the kids in my grade had Chihuahuas at home, and they had puppies. They agreed to give away one of the puppies in a raffle for the bake sale. It was a big deal- everybody wanted to win a puppy! My mother was a volunteer crossing guard that day. She gave me a quarter and told me to buy tickets for the raffle. I spent ten cents on candy and the other fifteen cents on raffle tickets. Guess who won? Our dog at the time, Tag, was not too happy to have some little puppy get all the attention. But he was such a good dog he put up with it.

I find that every dog is different-some like to play, some hunt, most just like to sniff around outside. Some are aggressive, some shy. I just let them be themselves and go where their nose goes."
