Kitten Season

Kitten season is the time of year when cats give birth, creating a surge of kittens.

Big-eyed, fuzzy kittens are irresistibly cute, but dozens of them coming in every day makes kitten season the most challenging time of the year at shelters everywhere.

Newborn felines are ridiculously adorable, with their sweet little faces, so while it may sound delightful to be surrounded by kittens, a downpour of the tiny helpless beings can quickly become a life-threatening flood.

It tends to start with a few litters showing up in shelters in early spring. By summer, they're pouring in. One reason for this massive influx is that well-meaning people often scoop up litters of kittens that they find outdoors and rush them to shelters, wrongly assuming that will save their lives.

Unfortunately, these good intentions may actually put kittens in greater danger of being killed. What many people don't realize is that the safest place for the kittens — and one that also decreases the burden on shelters — is to leave the kittens where they are, keep an eye out for the mother cat's return to make sure she's caring for her babies and, once they're old enough, humanely catch the family for spay/neuter surgery.

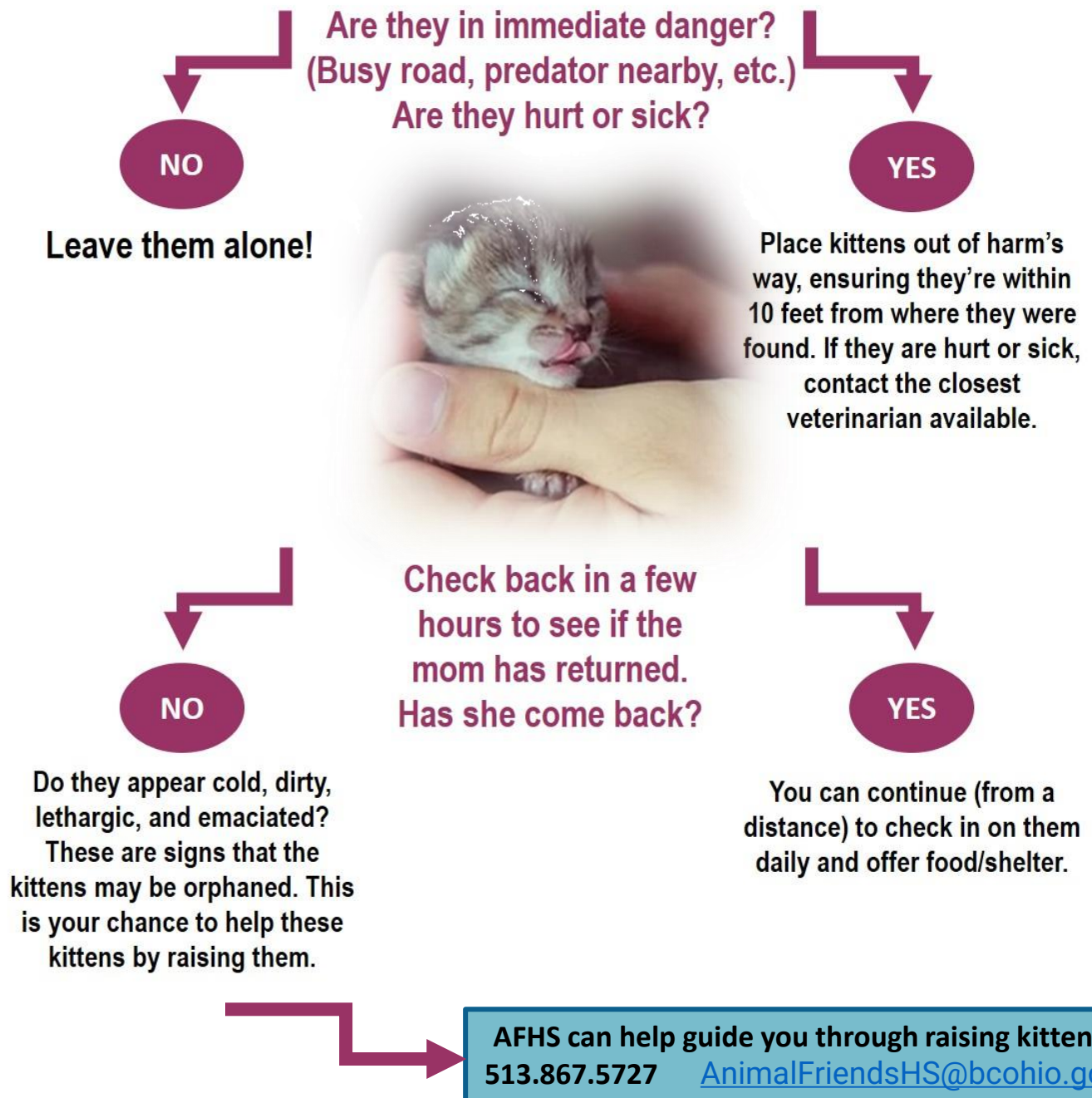


With their fragile immune systems, it's very labor-intensive caring for newborn, motherless kittens. Their best chance of survival is to be taken care of by their mother. When a litter does not have a momma, shelter staff must step in to do the care. Kittens under four weeks old cannot eat on their own or maintain body temperature. They need to be manually stimulated to urinate and defecate, which requires hands-on care every two to four hours. As you can see this is a large, time-consuming undertaking.

Enter the hero volunteers. AFHS is blessed to have a wonderful group of dedicated kitten fosters that take on the job of constant care of these tiny souls. Most fosters continue this care for 8 weeks, until the kittens are ready to be spayed/neutered and ready for adoption. We would love to have you on our life saving team!

Meet our new Executive Director

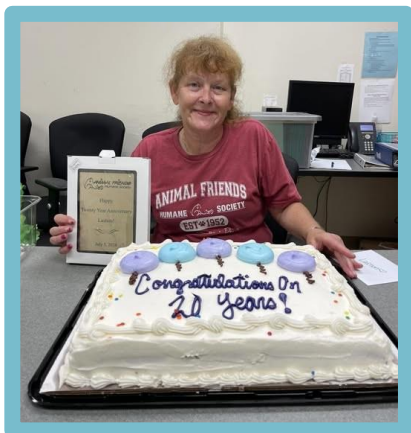

Animal Friend's mission is only possible with our many volunteer hearts and hands helping everyday.

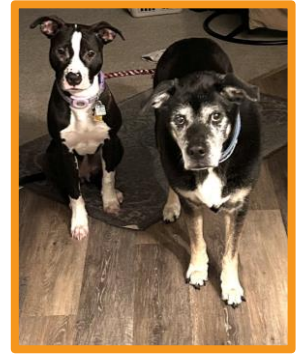

Volunteer Spotlight

Lisa Herd Currington



Lisa has been a dedicated volunteer at AFHS since 2011. Lisa has logged hundreds of hours walking and socializing dogs. In addition, Lisa has been a foster mom to litters of puppies. One of these litters included a puppy with Puppy Strangles, a rare and very serious inflammatory skin condition. **In many cases, strangles can be life-threatening if left untreated.** Lisa researched and learned everything she could about treating Strangles and successfully nursed the puppy back to health. Here he is 11 years later.

Last May, a puppy came to us after being found crying on a blanket behind an apartment dumpster. Upon intake she was diagnosed to be suffering from a severe case of Puppy Strangles. Shelter staff knew just who to call to help the pitiful puppy. Lisa immediately came for the puppy, even though, just the week before, she had lost her beloved 13-year old AF Alum and best friend, Eeyoree.

The puppy was in VERY bad condition when she came to us and Lisa put hours of love and care into Reinga's weak little body. Lisa's son, Logan, named the puppy Reinga (which means queen) to give her a strong name. Reinga's condition was serious. Lisa tells us, ***"It took months of love, care and a watchful eye. She is still fighting it. It destroyed her immune system and we are in the process of rebuilding it, which seems to be working. She gets stronger and bigger every day."*** Due to her efforts, Lisa saved the sweet little puppy. We can't thank Lisa enough for saving this little girl's life. It is so uplifting to see how much Reinga has grown and conquered.

'Foster Fail' Love

Jellybean came to us as our very first medical foster. He had recently undergone a leg amputation and still had a drainage tube in place that required close monitoring to ensure proper healing. The goal was to prevent him from accidentally tearing it out while running or playing. Jellybean's leg had to be amputated after he was found as a stray with what appeared to be a severely infected bite on his left front leg. When we picked him up, we instantly fell in love. He was the sweetest cat we had ever met! Sitting in his cage in our living room, he would look around with those big, hopeful eyes, silently begging to be let out so he could snuggle in our laps and purr contentedly. Naturally, we couldn't resist his charm. He got plenty of cuddles and even some supervised time out with our other cats.

As we cared for Jellybean - cleaning his drainage tube and administering his medications - we began to notice that he wasn't healing as he should. We reached out to Kim (cat foster coordinator) and she advised us to bring him back in. After additional testing and stronger antibiotics to combat the infection, the surgery site began to heal.



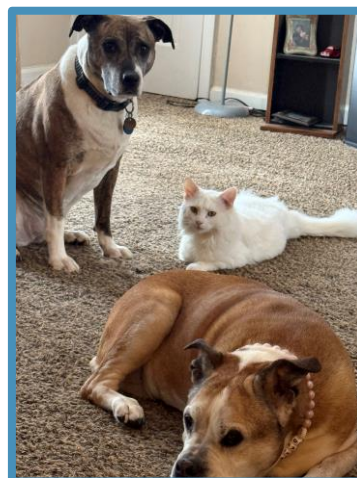

When we got the all-clear to bring Jellybean back home, we picked him up knowing he needed to be a permanent part of our family and we officially adopted him.

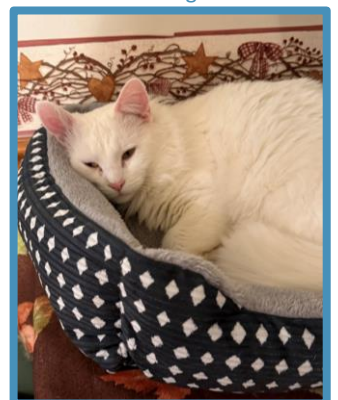

Fostering is such a rewarding experience, it provides animals with a much-needed mental and physical break from the hustle and bustle of shelter life, allowing them to heal and thrive in a home environment. Sometimes fostering leads to a 'foster fail' where a temporary placement becomes permanent - and that's okay!

Thank you to **The Hamilton Community Foundation**

December, 2024: **The Hamilton Community Foundation** awarded our shelter \$37,720 to revamp our adoption kennels. Our goal: To improve each dog's experience while awaiting their forever home. Dogs who feel comfortable show adoptive families their true potential and are chosen.

Each kennel has a small door that is raised/lowered for access to an outdoor run. The existing doors were thin sheets of metal damaged by age and use, unable to block icy drafts in winter or heat waves in summer. The new doors are insulated, keeping the kennel consistently temperature-comfortable for the dogs. These doors are easier to open/close, and safer for the dog passing through.

Special thanks go to **The Hamilton Community Foundation** for generously funding this desperately-needed repair, and for patiently working with us to find the perfect solution; to the many Foundation members who made private donations to pay for additional work; and to our amazing volunteers who opened their homes for fostering during construction.

In November, dedicated Animal Friends supporters **Kathleen and Roger Gross** offered to start a Matching Gift Campaign dedicated to the health needs of community cats and kittens. Thank you to **The Greater Cincinnati Foundation**

Early 2024, Animal Friends had more than 500 pets awaiting spay/neuter surgery before adoption. The nationwide shortage of veterinarians, our lack of financial resources to outsource the surgery (if available appointments could even be found), our continued intake of sick, injured, or orphaned kittens and pregnant dogs/puppies—all contributed to the increasing backlog that delayed adoption.



The Greater Cincinnati Foundation awarded us a Grant for \$10,000 to address this overwhelming problem. Their grant subsidized 14 spay/neuter days with a high-volume veterinarian. Within months, every pet received surgery, vaccines, and health checks before adoption. A portion of those funds paid for surgery for pets owned by Butler County residents who wanted but could not afford the surgery, keeping much-loved pets in their homes instead of surrendered to the shelter.

Animal Friends extends our deepest appreciation to **The Greater Cincinnati Foundation** for their help in saving little lives, preventing unwanted litters, opening foster space, and keeping pets in their homes!
