### Ally's Bucket List – A Hospice Dog's Adventures

Too often, animals come into Animal Friends in very poor health and often in pain. Sometimes it's discovered that it is too late to nurse them back to health due to a terminal illness, so tough decisions have to then be made on whether or not any care can or should be continued. Comfort and quality of life is of primary importance, and there's always a concern as to whether or not a person or family can be found who is willing to accept a new animal into their home knowing the reality of how short their time with it may be.

When Ally, a senior pit mix, was found and brought to Animal Friends as a stray, it was apparent that she must have been living in a cage for quite some time because her lower body was stained from lying in urine. She had open sores on her paws and hair loss on her body, and she was frequently urinating blood which can be a common sign of a urinary tract infection (UTI). Ally started on a course of antibiotic treatments in hopes of resolving what was first believed to be a severe UTI, but when her symptoms continued, she was sent to a local vet clinic for further workup to determine why she wasn't improving. An ultrasound determined Ally had a bladder tumor, and she was given only 6-9 months to live.

Staff and volunteers had already fallen in love with Ally and felt she deserved to have as good a life as possible in the little time she had left. So they shared her story on Facebook and waited in hopes of finding an adopter who would understand her medical needs and be prepared to take on Hospice care.

Amber Hayes was the huge-hearted adopter who saw the shelter's Facebook post and accepted the responsibility. She and her 12-year-old daughter, Kyliee, graciously tended to all of Ally's physical and emotional needs. It was Kyliee and Amber's sister, Shelby Rogers, who came up with the idea of a doggie Bucket List. So, Amber created "Ally's Bucket List" on Facebook and shared the Hospice journey with others who could appreciate the efforts.

Ally outlived the doctor's prediction and lived two more years. She thrived under all of the activities of her Bucket List, which included about 15 things to do before she would die. Favorites were eating ice cream, going camping in the woods, going to the beach, having breakfast in bed, meeting Santa Claus, and playing dress up. Ally loved dress up! She had clothes for special occasions such as holidays, and she would get excited when she knew she would be getting dressed.

Ally's bucket list item, "Have a fancy tea party with friends," was her

final activity celebrated as a birthday bash. The only item she didn't finish was "Get lost in a corn maze."

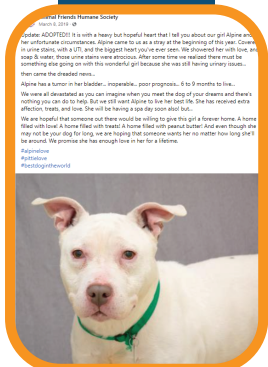
Nine months after Ally passed, Amber was contacted by Animal Friends about another pit mix in the shelter that required Hospice care. It took her two weeks to think it over, but she ultimately decided she would love to help save another Hospice dog, and she "fell in love with" and adopted Wally after going in to meet him. Like Ally, Wally was found as a stray and taken to Animal Friends. He was also found in poor condition and sent out to have additional medical tests performed. Three tumors were removed and biopsied, and all came back positive for a high Grade 2 mast cell tumor. His life expectancy was anywhere from 3 months to 1 year. Amber has faith that it will be at least a year. His health has improved since surgery and he has settled into her house nicely. Amber said, "He loves 'Potato,' our little Chihuahua, and she absolutely adores him, although Potato doesn't get along with anyone else in the house."

Again, Amber went to Facebook to share Wally's story and his personal "Wally's Bucket List," which included jumping in piles of leaves, have a backyard picnic, destroy 20 stuffies in a single day, chase bubbles, meet Santa, make a calendar featuring me and all of my siblings, enjoy some ice cream, and a few others.

Kyliee, Amber's daughter, is in the 6th grade at Ross Middle School in Hamilton. She also has a huge heart for dogs and recently saved the life of an 8 week old puppy that had been seriously injured by an all-terrain vehicle. The puppy's back legs had been paralyzed and the owners admitted that they had left her to die. (Yes, there are those kinds of people.) The poor puppy was covered in fleas and ticks, and after clean up, a vet did surgery on her hind leg, and now she has 90% mobility. Kyliee named the puppy Molly Sue and is keeping her new forever friend.

For years, Amber has fostered or adopted only disabled or senior dogs, so caring for Hospice dogs from Animal Friends was an easy transition. Friends and community support have helped Amber cover the medical costs associated with caring for a Hospice pet. 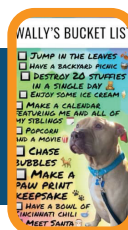
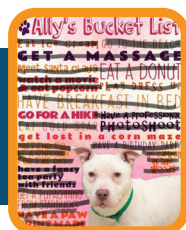

# Microchip Identifies and Reunites Dog Missing 4 Years

A dog, stolen four years earlier, was recently returned to her loving family at Animal Friends. Everyone of the office staff was crying along with the pet's family as they filled out papers to take her home. The Depews had rushed to the shelter after receiving a phone call that their dog was brought in by a Hamilton policeman.

Taylor Schleidt, who works in the front office at Animal Friends, remembers checking the Dog Receiving area and finding the sweet black and brown Cocker Spaniel that was brought to the shelter the night before.

"She was very timid at first, but let me get in the cage with her to pet for a minute and scan her back for a microchip."

The "chirp" of the scanner was a wonderful sound indicating a microchip had been detected in the Cocker Spaniel. Using an online microchip search, Taylor typed in the microchip number and discovered an up-to-date owner contact number on file. She hopefully phoned the number.

"I remember the conversation like it was yesterday," said Taylor.

**Answering voice: "Hello."**

**Taylor: "Hi, this is Taylor calling from Animal Friends Humane Society. Is this Amber?"**

**Voice: "Yes, this is."**

**Taylor: "Are you missing someone?"**

**Amber: "What? Am I missing someone?"**

**Taylor: "We have Cutie here. She was brought in as a stray dog last night. Are you missing her?"**

Amber didn't say anything for a minute but could be heard crying on the other end of the phone. "You don't understand," she sniffled. "My Cutie has been missing for four years. She was stolen out of my yard four years ago, a week after getting her spayed and micro-chipped."

Taylor says she will absolutely never forget the conversation with Amber, who came in that same day to claim Cutie. "It's a reminder to

pet owners to get their animals microchipped."

The Depews will probably never know who stole Cutie from their backyard. She and her brother dog had been tethered separately in their runs. Her tether had been disconnected and attached to the other dog. Someone had deliberately stolen her.

The Depews never gave up looking for Cutie and did everything they could think of to find her within the tri-state area. They were devastated, worried, and felt helpless. Even after 4 years they never forgot and still dreamed of her.

Cutie was an 8-week old puppy when the Depews adopted her. She was about 6 years old when stolen. Now she is a senior citizen doggie. Amber and husband Chad's two daughters were small children when Cutie was a puppy. Now Cassie is 16, and a sophomore at Talawanda, and Lyndsay is 13 and in the 7th grade. Strange as it may seem, Cassie had talked to one of her teachers about Cutie the very day Amber received the call from the shelter. When she came home from school, she was shocked and couldn't believe that Cutie had been found.

Unfortunately, Cutie must have had a very rough and miserable life during the four years apart from her family. She was malnourished, flea-ridden, had skin problems, missing hair, and weak muscles when found. Thank goodness she will be living her golden years back home with the ones she loves, and she will be receiving the medical attention of a veterinarian.

"SHE ABSOLUTELY KNEW US," Amber and Chad emphasized! When they took her home, "She ran inside to her comfort area, the place she always went to."

Cutie is on the mend, happy and pampered by her devoted family. After being stolen, the horrors she must have gone through, have been replaced with the devotion of her true family.

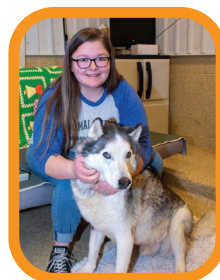

Yes, out of bed where he sleeps with his human mom, Sue, and doggie sibling, Surrey, and sometimes a foster dog.

Georgi is a shy guy with big bright eyes that are alert around strangers when he is on walks. At home, he is the Hargrave's security system. His high-pitched voice alerts Sue to anything outside the house. He's a doggie alarm.

After visiting a groomer, Georgi's black and white fur is soft, shiny, and a bit fluffy. It took a few visits before he felt comfortable having a stranger bathe him and clip his nails. Maybe he realized the grooming made him even more handsome.

Just say "Grandma," and Georgi's ears perk up, and he has a look of anticipation!

He loves visiting Grandma Betty Hargraves, who spoils him with treats and lets him sleep with her. Human beds

Surrey, 7, was a rescue from a North Carolina shelter where she was scheduled to be put down in 2016. She became a "foster failure" because she was such a good fit in the Hargraves home. Surrey was the #1 Butler County Dog in 2020.
